

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CELTIC LIFE INTERVIEW with the founder, robert currie



After two challenging years, New York City's best and brightest Celtic Christmas celebration returns to the spotlight this Holiday Season. The Celtic Life reconnected with the event's founder Bob Currie about the 2022 event.

You've enjoyed strong public support for this year's gathering – how did that all come together?

After something of a hiatus from creating full-scale live productions, we were chomping at the bit to get back into high gear. Pre-production work for 2022 started

in January. My first order of business was to re-secure the booking of Irish soprano Sharon Lyons. Prior to the pandemic, I had "discovered" her incredible EP, "Simply Christmas" – I was hooked. We instantly contacted her to join us. The problem being that the pandemic had made her appearances impossible over these last two years. I was not about to let that happen again. So, with Sharon on board, we set out to chart the musical selections with music director Steve Gibb.

I began to experience the emotional "rush" of producing a full-out live production again. By August, we started receiving ticket inquiries. The Christmas magic was back. I also helped assemble a crack media marketing team from Canada that brought renewed energy, brilliant ideas and outstanding creativity to the show. Between Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, our social media following is at an all-time high. We also established and are still running a GoFundMe campaign to help make up for the financial losses we experienced under Covid. The response has been humbling. Proceeds from the concert not only cover production expenses, but fund all our scholarships, special events and sponsorships for the coming year. As a purely non-profit, volunteer-driven organization, these funds are critical to our mission of preserving and promoting Celtic heritage and culture. Ticket sales have outpaced previous years at this time, and we will likely be declaring some Sold Out notices soon.

What can audiences expect at this year's shows?

Super excited to be back. In addition to Ms. Lyons' debut, we will be bringing back many of our regular favorites. This is not merely a "company," its a family gathering of sorts for both performers and audiences alike. We have some wonderful new material planned and will be dedicating the concert to the memory of HM Queen Elizabeth II. We will also be premiering the third in a series of Royal-inspired works commissioned especially for the concert. We're delighted to be welcoming back our Narrator, the Rev. Dr. Susan Currie and our Readers, Andrew Weir and James Robinson. Both gentlemen performed together in the 1995 film, "Braveheart," as young Hamish Campbell and young William Wallace respectively. Weir has transitioned from acting into a successful career in the scotch whisky trade and a leading interpreter of Robert Burns. Robinson has continued in film and television having appeared in "Outlander" and stars in the newly released film, "Saving Christmas Spirit."

Why is it an important event for the Celtic Community?

Well to start with, this concert brings together some of the finest Scottish and Irish performers. The program offers such a wide assortment of traditional instruments and readings that those in the know will appreciate and enjoy but we also get to introduce a new audience who may never have experienced this music before. Additionally, we will be performing in Scots Gaelic and Irish. It is not often these languages are heard in such a setting, rather they sometimes are sadly delegated to language-specific events before a limited audience. The concert's impact goes way beyond the "live" experience by bringing educational and cultural heritage scholarships to deserving students, sponsoring major Celtic events like "Tartan Day on Ellis Island," the Royal National Mod and the US National Celtic Harp Championship. Our organization maintains a year-long schedule of events and programming. Honestly, our impact goes way beyond the Celtic community alone. Our audiences come from all walks of life and backgrounds. In a world where the secular has taken over the sacred, the Pipes of Christmas is about just that - Christmas. Sure, we love Santa and Frosty and Rudolph, but you can find that just about anywhere these days. We choose to focus on the spiritual emotions of the holiday. Given that this is our 24th year, our audiences seem to be glad we remain focused and watchful.

What has the response been like so far?

Most encouraging! Ticket sales are booming, and our other fundraising programs are flourishing. At the end of the day, it tells us we are offering an event that is valued and cherished across the Celtic community. Its quite humbling to know what a holiday tradition we've created. This promises to be our best production yet!

What inspired the new EP, and how did you choose the material?

We maintain a vast library of live recordings and this collection keeps growing with every subsequent year. Having produced two highly successful compilation CDs ("The Best of the Pipes of Christmas" Vols 1 and 2,) we wanted to become more familiar with the digital download experience. We chose a seven-track selection of some of our more recent performances, including several from our 2020 virtual production and remixed and remastered a very nice collection of tunes. We decided to make this EP available exclusively to our GoFundMe donors as a premium for gifts of \$100 or more. The response has been great, and we have created a unique way of recognizing our supporters. Great success!

What are your plans for the event in 2023 and beyond?

Just wait! We will be marking a quarter century of performances next year and we plan to pull out all the stops. Just now, we're staying focused on this December.

About Sharon:

Originally from Dublin, Sharon currently lives in Co. Kerry, Ireland with her husband and son. A much sought-after vocalist, she is in constant demand for concert, tv, soundtrack and session work. Sharon's unique ethereal voice transcends across genres from early medieval chant, to traditional lish, to classical and contemporary music. Sharon has performed nationally and internationally, for presidents and popes, and has appeared in Vikings for the History Channel US. Alongside her singing, Sharon teaches music, and directs choirs across treland. She is also the founder of the Kerry Vocal Academy.





CELTIC LIFE INTERVIEW with Irish Soprano, Sharon Lyons



When Irish soprano Sharon Lyons takes the stage at this year's Pipes of Christmas concerts in New York and New Jersey, she will be carrying the torch of tradition.

What are your roots?

I am originally from a beautiful fishing village called Howth in Dublin, Ireland. My family on both sides are all from Dublin.

Where do you currently reside?

I'm currently living on the Ring of Kerry,

in a town called Killorglin. Believe it or not, this town is famous for its annual Puck Fair Festival, which is said to have started over 400 years ago. Each year in August, a goat is taken from the side of the mountain, crowned and then a threeday festival of music, fairs, and more ensues.

When and why did you start singing?

My mom will tell you that at a nativity play in preschool, I shushed my classmate for singing out of tune, so I think from the age of 3, its safe to say I was singing!! I then joined a children's choir in my local church, and I have been singing ever since. It's always been part of me and what I do.

Are they the same reasons you do it today?

I suppose singing is a way of life for me. I trained as a classical violinist also, and during my lessons when I was younger, I used to ask could I sing back the melodies to my teacher. I always had a good ear, so when she used to play the piece, I was working on I was able to sing it back in my head before playing it then on the violin. No week has gone by since my earliest memory that hasn't included singing, whether that was in the church, or school, with friends, in the Academy of Music and so on. I can't tell you the reasons why I sing, only that it's a natural part of me, and I know no other way.

What are the challenges involved with the vocation?

The biggest challenge I think is not recognising burn out. When you do what you love for a living, you never feel the drudgery of being overworked until one day you wake up and (in my case) you have no voice. My body literally has to tell me in a physical way to take a break. Being self-employed also means it's very difficult to say No to any work that comes your way. I have gotten much better at this especially since having my son and understanding the true importance of a healthy work/life balance.

What are the rewards?

Oh wow, what a question. As mentioned above, doing what you love for living is the biggest reward. Before moving to Kerry, I worked for many undertakers and singing at funerals is probably one of the most rewarding jobs I have ever done. In times of the deepest grief, when most people feel helpless in trying to console or sympathise with a family, music creates a powerful, safe, and healing grieving space. I find teaching my private students and choirs a very fulfilling part of the job. Watching previously self-conscious/nervous students overcome their stage fright and sing is such a joy. Also taking a group of 'non musicians' and watching their faces light up when they sing in harmony for the first time gives me such a lift. Performing is a very special reward also. Standing in front of and sing with an orchestra is the best feeling in the world. I could go on and on. Every day is a gift.

How have you evolved as an artist over time?

I think it has taken me until very recently to understand myself as a singer. I was never interested in the opera path, and as such I felt that I fell through the cracks a little on the music scene. For a long time my main work was centred around the Cathedral in Dublin, and as a result I was labelled as a 'church singer' by most. The truth is I enjoy singing all styles of music. From early chant, through to modern pop. I think my classical voice lies most suitably in the earlier music such as Handel and Bach, but I will as happily sing an Irish folk song if I had a choice. I know now my uniqueness lies in my versatility, and there's very few singers that will/can cross styles easily.

What have been some career highlights?

I have sung for our president many times, and that's always both a pleasure and privilege. I have performed many times on the national stages here, national TV & radio and have had wonderful opportunities singing solo for major events in the country. I spent a Summer in Boston under the NUFAX exchange programme

which was funded by the US Government and that was an amazing experience. I sang for Pope Francis in 2018, and the Dalai Lama a few years prior to that. I appeared in the US TV series Vikings singing a self-composed chant 9 years ago. To this day, I still get fan mail and followers from that one piece. Incredible!

What inspired your new Christmas album?

I have wanted to record a full-length album for some time, and this year it was finally possible. My idea was to take some Christmas classics and give them new life, and I really believe I have achieved this. I have appeared on so many other artists recordings that it was time to have my own.

What can listeners expect?

I commissioned new arrangements of these Christmas classics, for solo voice (myself), 20-piece orchestra and choir. The album has a mix of tracks, with 8 orchestral, 2 piano-based and one unaccompanied. You can expect a selection of uplifting, movie soundtrack-style, Irish traditional and choral music.

Is your creative process more "inspirational" or "perspirational"?

I think the latter! I leave the creative/inspirational part to the experts in that area. My great friend Damian Gallagher was the man who arranged the music, and he really is exceptional at what he does. I love singing his arrangements and he knows my voice particularly well.

What makes a good live show?

In my opinion if the artist is authentic and good at what they do, then this will shine through in performance and very little extra is needed. Some of the most moving and memorable concerts I have attended have had no light or smoke displays, no backing dancers, or projected images, just them and their musicians. You want the audience to feel your sincerity, and to leave with that impression.

What are your thoughts on the current state of the Irish music scene?

It is getting better every day. In the folk, traditional and opera world, there have been huge strides forward and more opportunities are appearing every day for artists. Arts Council funding has gone from strength to strength and continues to help the sector. This is so important.

How did the COVID-19 pandemic impact you, both personally and professionally?

Both myself and my husband were out of work due to Covid, however, as we had recently welcomed our son into the world, this unexpected extended maternity leave was very special, and we got time with him that we never would have had otherwise. Of course, it was stressful at the same time, but our government did look after us well and provided a basic liveable income payment. I am a homebird so having to stay at home was never an issue. So many musicians I know got extremely creative during the lockdown and produced amazing work. I just took a step back from it all and enjoyed the breathing space.

What advice might you have for younger people looking to enjoy a career in music?

If it is your passion, do it. There are so many ways now to earn a living in music, both in front of and behind the scenes. For example, the world of music technology has exploded (especially with social media), and this world will continue to grow and grow. It's a very exciting time to be a young artist.

What's on your agenda for the rest of 2022, and going into 2023?

I have a couple of Irish solo Christmas performances coming up between now and early December, then I head to Germany as soprano soloist in Bach's Christmas Oratorio. I get back to Ireland for two days which include my son's 3rd birthday and then I fly to NYC to be a soloist in the Pipes of Christmas Annual concerts in NYC and NJ. I fly home 5 days before Christmas day and then have a busy few days with music in the cathedral here in Kerry before having some time off over New Years. I worked on the theme song for a new video gaming company that's due to launch early next year, and I have other exciting things in the pipeline to be confirmed over the coming weeks. Its busy but I'm loving every minute of it.

The Lord Lyon Society is a Scottish charity established by the Lord Lyon King of Arms, Dr Joe Morrow, CBE. The Lord Lyon King of Arms is the head of the Court of the Lord Lyon, Scotland's heraldic authority, responsible for granting and regulating the use of coats of arms in Scotland. The Court of the Lord Lyon is custodian of the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland which was established by an Act of the Scottish Parliament in the year 1672, has been maintained and added by the Court of the Lord Lyon ever since right up to the present day and now runs to some 100 Volumes which are in daily use.
